Action Items from August 2nd Executive Meeting

Capital Pride

The PSAC-NCR Pride working group is preparing for the Capital Pride Parade on August 28th. Organizers are looking for volunteers to help with decorating the float, marching in the parade and organizing food and drinks for the parade. The OAC recently purchased 200 Progress Pride paper flags for PSAC members – The Progress Pride flag was developed in 2018 by Daniel Quasar (xe/xyr pronouns). Based on the iconic rainbow flag from 1978, the redesign celebrates the diversity of the LGBTQ community and calls for a more inclusive society by shifting focus and emphasis to what is important in our current community climate. "to provide education to public servants, management and staff on the history of Aboriginal peoples, including the history and legacy of residential schools, the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples, Treaties and Aboriginal rights, Indigenous law, and Aboriginal—Crown relations. This will require skills-based training in intercultural competency, conflict resolution, human rights, and anti-racism."

• To call attention to an ongoing failure by the federal government to meaningfully enact the Calls to Action that would alter the disparate realities that Indigenous peoples experience in this country.

PROPOSED: Ottawa Area Council Municipal Election Sub-Committee

The objectives of the sub-committee are to:

- 1. Establish a social media campaign related to the Ottawa Municipal Election on October 24th 2022 that links municipal issues to PSAC campaigns and priorities. For example:

 - b. The City of Ottawa's 10-Year Housing and Homelessness Plan 2020-2030
 - i. Links to the PSAC's Social Justice Fund & Anti-Poverty Initiatives
- 2. Plan and deliver one (1) activity related to the 2022 Municipal elections, either alone or in collaboration with other area committees or community organizations.

Labour Day 2022 Update Report – OAC July 28, 2022

We were in contact with the march organizers (ODLC) and they confirmed the following -

Labour Day Route, the march will be: Start City Hall - South on Elgin - West on Somerset - North on Bank - East on Laurier and back to City Hall. ODLC mentioned that a marching band will be part of the event.

Parking will available at City Hall and side streets - No charge on holiday.

Confirmed accessibility and safety protocols as per PSAC guidelines. Accessible washrooms available at City Hall.

Recommended that participants bring their own water and adhere to public safety covid advice.

There will be no ODLC events after the march, the ODLC committee decided that due to the changing situation with covid and return to school in September that they would wait another year for food events and gathering after the march.

The OAC registration form for the march has been sent to the ODLC.

The chair and I met with PSAC communications officer and the social media call out is being arranged as well as an RSVP registration for members who want to participate in the march.

The stock taking of the items in the OAC locker is ongoing to see what items we have on hand that would be of use for the march.

Next Steps:

Given that the ODLC is not doing any post march events the next meeting of the OAC executive should discuss alternative plans to the proposed barbeque that was decided on at the last general meeting.
